- Please list the course numbers on your portfolio pages so that we can cross-reference with transcript(s).
- Please list all software used to create the work on your portfolio pages.
- Please submit a completed Course Waiver/Transfer Request form.

For placement into architecture studio and media classes, please submit as many of the following as possible:

1. **Floor plans, sections, site plans**
2. **Physical models**
3. Freehand sketches
4. **Diagrams used as a conceptual design tool** – Diagrams can be drawings or models, 2D or 3D
5. Representation of topography in a drawing and/or model
6. Site analysis
7. Program diagrams
8. Precedent analysis
9. **List all software programs used** – We are looking for Photoshop, Illustrator, InDesign, Rhino, Revit, Twinmotion (or Enscape or Lumion).

If you are transferring from a NAAB-accredited program, most of your architecture courses will transfer. To aid the review process, please attach a degree break down and highlight the courses you have taken. Most architecture schools publish a semester-by-semester breakdown of required courses on their websites.
