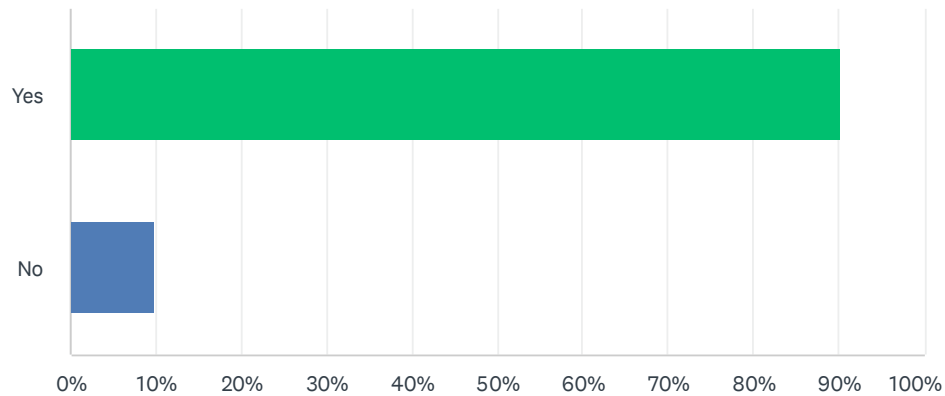


Q1 Are you currently working in an architecture or related field?

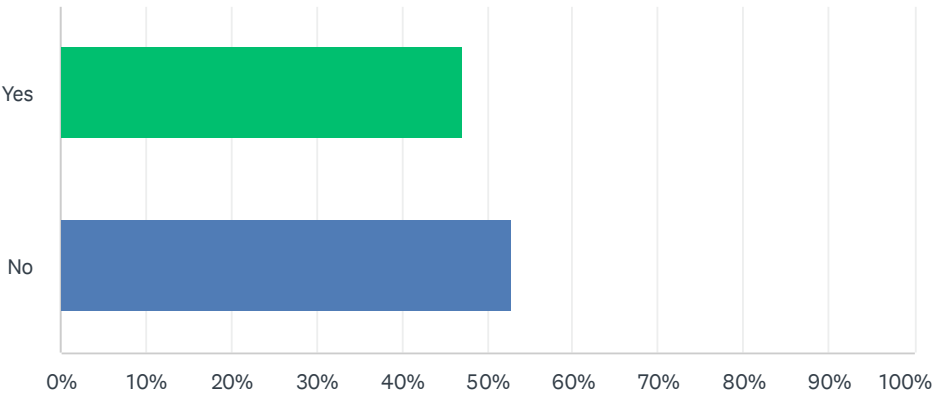

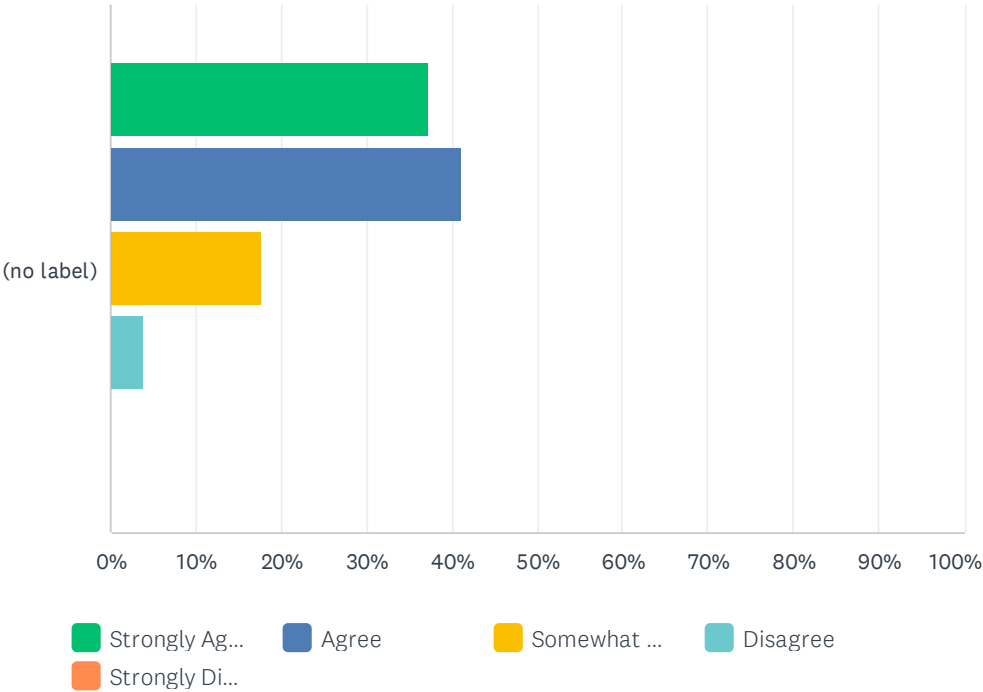

Q5 My undergraduate architecture degree prepared me for a career as an architect.

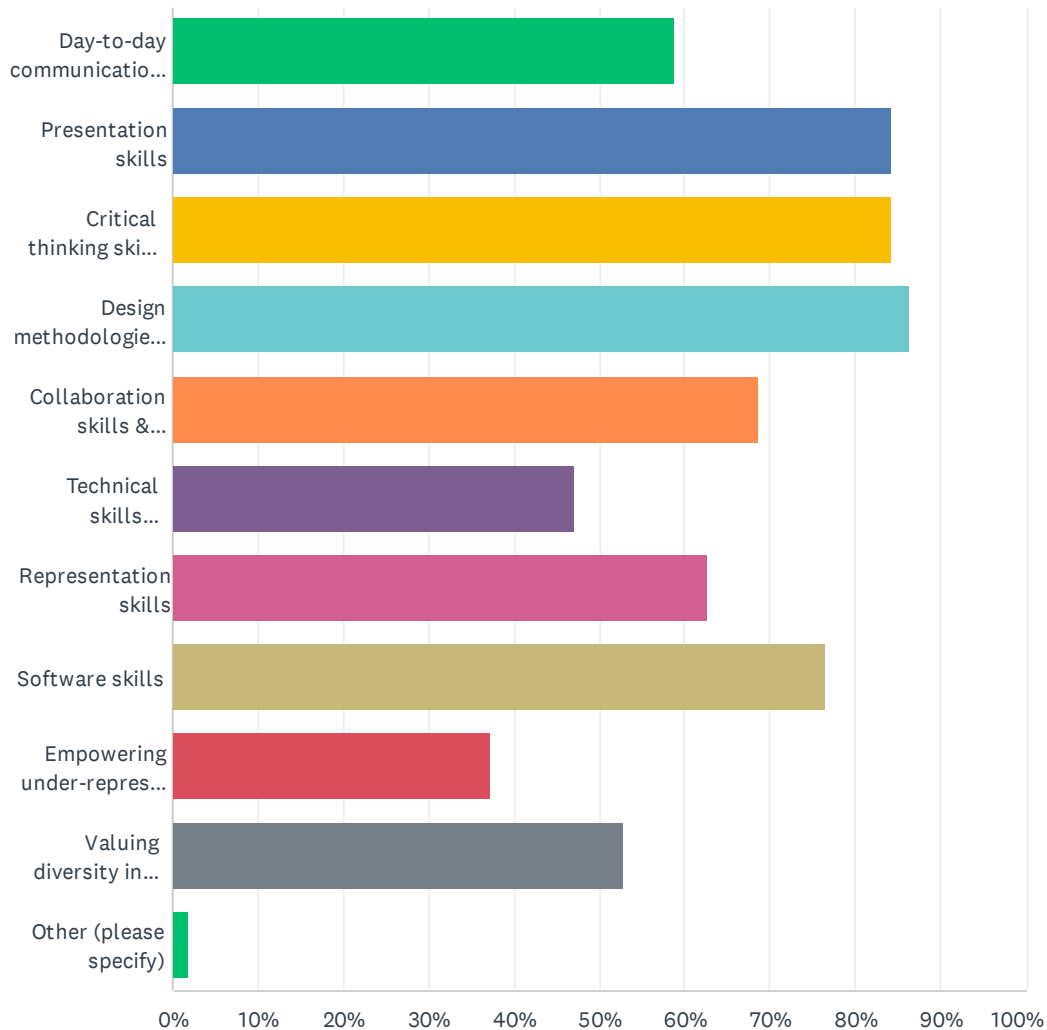

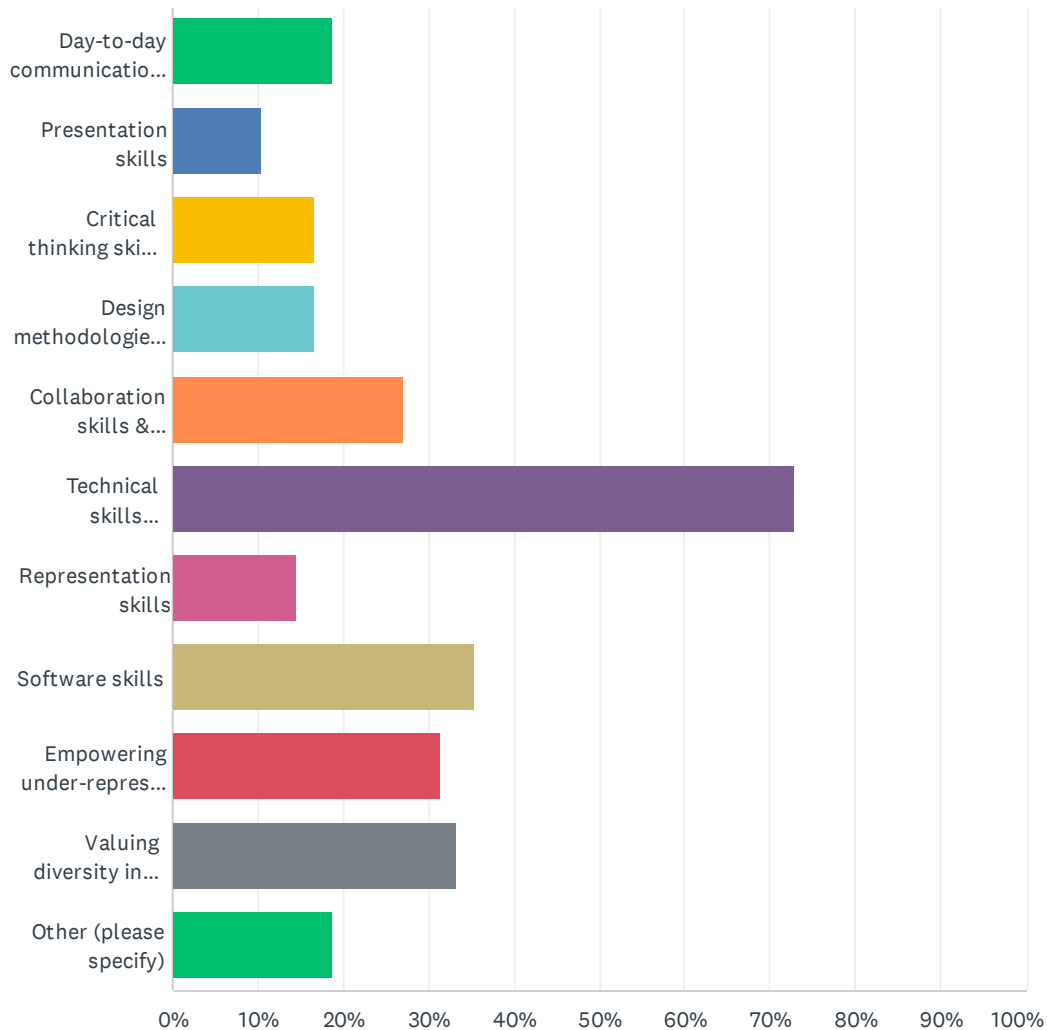

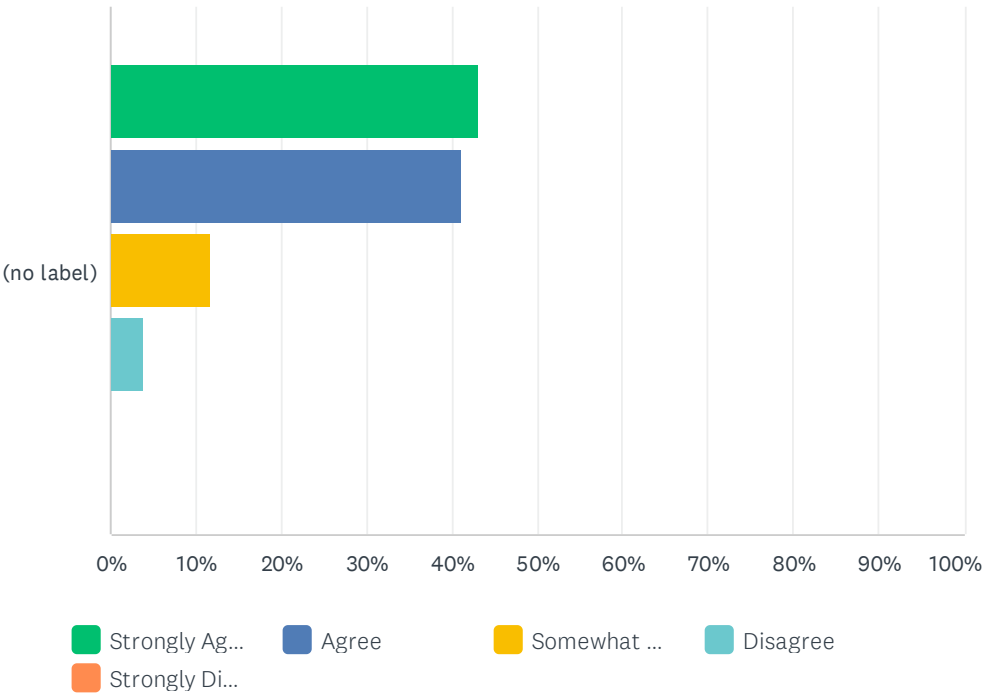

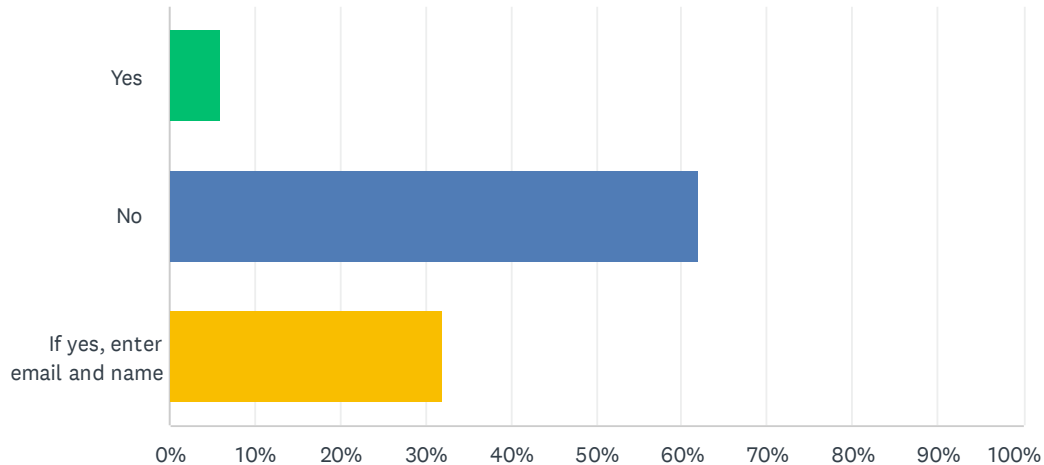

2	Overall my time there was informative. I learned a lot and most of the skills that I learned from the school have prepared me to address many of the scenarios that I have encountered. Sometimes scenarios that I did not even think I would ever be discussing, but due to the research that I did in school on some subjects, I was able to respond to and give adequate problem-solving advice. For this thank you :) In going forward I think you all have a good foundation, and with a little tweaking your undergraduate program could be one of the best in country (this is not an overstatement). The following are some of the things that I've noticed while looking for jobs, as well as what I would have loved to experience while in undergrad. 1. Job Experience Level (Internships - Yr. 1) I think there should be a way for everyone upon graduation to have interned with at least 1-2 firms in SF or the California for at least 1 yr (could possibly replace a studio or 2, I believe this would give students a better insight to day-to-day workings within the architectural field and would better prepare them for the hiring market, seeing as everyone requires that you at least have 1 year of experience upon graduation.) It in a way should not be an option, but a part of the curriculum. 2. On paper and in Reality Thinking back on it, I think 4-5 year programs could both become accredited. Especially if there was a way to finish thesis at year 4, and add design-build (real-life experience) as year 5. Thus you graduate with an accredited degree and hands-on experience--which a lot of states outside of SF require. 3. Planet Conscience is a must! If possible everyone upon graduation should have some level of LEED accreditation. I've seen this a couple of times on new-hire applications. 4. Teamwork I think working in groups is a must too, but should be evaluated both as a partnership and individually, because in the working world someone not completing task hurts the team-- yes, but the individual is the one to ultimately pay for their mistakes (being removed from the job). Perhaps when there are group projects there should be contracts of responsibility? ** When there are team situations there should be a route weekly check-in with professors about the workings of the group. ** 5. Software diversity and base knowledge I love Rhino and Revit is great, but there are a lot of programs that could be used in architecture out there, and many people are looking for those with this knowledge base. There are a lot of 3D software programs that if not taught in a course should be like after school curriculum for people to partake in. ** Rendering courses (artistic and photorealism), (this should be a 1st-2nd year must-have) (maybe even skill tested before grad) because it is a actual job position, and you will have to demo skills. ** Software language testing. knowing the names and workings or the programs listed on resumes, some firms will give you a written test you on this information. - computational arch. courses could also be a plus 6. Model Making Model Making (should be a required course--esp. because it is a actual job position in the field. to which requires you to have a knowledge base of: basic model making skills; 3d printing; CNC milling; and robotic are modeling.) 7. Presentation Confidence Public speaking/presentation specifically for architecture should be a required course Portfolio and Interview practice with varying scenarios would be a great after school program. 8. The Possibilities Available After Graduation In order for one to be prepared for the job market they must have a well-round base and realistic understanding of the opportunities out there. Architecture isn't their only field option. I think letting students know the possibilities of where such skillsets curated through the architecture program could lead them.
